
Breaking Down ECQ #5 For an SES Federal Job: Building Coalitions

To qualify for a federal leadership position as a senior executive, you must be able to break down ECQ #5. ECQs are Executive Core Qualifications that are based on the criteria set by the Office of Personnel Management for leadership skills essential to succeed in the Senior Executive Service (SES).
